

## SCERT Tripura and Sterlite EdIndia Foundation Host Teaching Plan Competition Phase II



**18, Feb, 2026, Agartala, Tripura:** The State Council of Educational Research and Training (SCERT), in collaboration with Sterlite EdIndia Foundation, organised the State-Level Teaching Plan Competition Phase II, followed by a prize distribution ceremony in Agartala, West Tripura.

The competition brought together pre-service teachers from across the state, providing them with a platform to demonstrate innovative, learner-centred, and competency-based lesson planning aligned with the vision of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020.

Phase II of the competition focused on refining and presenting shortlisted teaching plans at the state level, allowing participants to showcase pedagogical clarity, creativity, and alignment with learning outcomes.



The prize distribution ceremony recognised outstanding participants for their innovative lesson designs and commitment to effective teaching practices. The initiative not only celebrated excellence but also reinforced the importance of structured teacher preparation in shaping confident and classroom-ready educators.

Winner of the competition was Miss. Tania Dey, 2<sup>nd</sup> year D.El.Ed from College of Teacher Education, Kumarghat where she happily stated that “My focus was on preparing for the classroom presentation, I used the techniques taught in my class and by Sterlite EdIndia foundation to make a very good lesson plan”.
